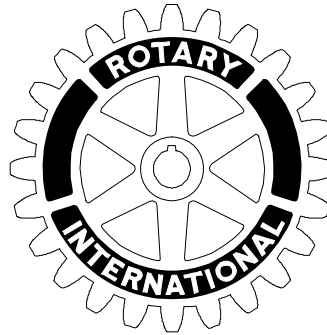

# MINUTES

of the

## JULY 2007 MEETING

### Board of Directors of Rotary International

The Board of Directors of Rotary International held its first meeting of the year on 21 June 2007 in Salt Lake City, Utah, U.S.A.

\*\*\*\*\*

Present were: President Wilfrid J. Wilkinson, President-elect Dong-Kurn Lee, Vice-President Michael K. McGovern, Treasurer Ian H.S. Riseley, Executive Committee Chair Örsçelik Balkan, other directors, Kjell-Åke Åkesson, Monty J. Audenart, Raffaele Pallotta d'Acquapendente, Thomas A. Branum, Sr., Michael J. Johns, Ashok M. Mahajan, R. Gordon McInally, Donald L. Mebus, Paul A. Netzel, Kazuhiko Ozawa, Themistocles A.C. Pinho, Barry Rassin, Bernard L. Rosen, Yoshimasa Watanabe, and General Secretary Edwin H. Futa. Also present was Trustee Mark Daniel Maloney.

Alice Baehler served as secretary of the meeting. Other staff present were Joe Brownlee, Peter DeBerge, Patricia Groenewold, Kathy Kessenich, Peter Markos, Andrew McDonald, Theresa Nissen Konda Silverthorn, and L.J. Williams. Riccardo di Cola, Eiko Terao, and Roberto Torquato served as staff interpreters.

Under the guidance of the president, the general secretary had prepared an advance memorandum for this meeting containing items for consideration with background information and analyses. Those items, along with others initiated during this meeting, constituted the agenda of the meeting as reflected in the remainder of these minutes.

#### 1. Appointment of the Vice-President

*Statement:* As mandated by RI Bylaws section 6.020.1., the president announced his selection of a vice-president for 2007-08.

*DECISION:* The Board notes with approval the president's selection of Michael K. McGovern as the

vice-president of Rotary International for the 2007-08 Rotary year.

#### 2. Appointment of the Treasurer

*Statement:* RI Bylaws section 6.020.2. provides for the president to select a treasurer from among those directors serving their second year in office.

*DECISION:* The Board notes with approval the president's selection of Ian H.S. Riseley as the treasurer of Rotary International for the 2007-08 Rotary year.

#### 3. Election of and Terms of Reference for the Executive Committee

*Statement:* The RI Bylaws provide that the Board may appoint an Executive Committee and prescribe its terms of reference. *Rotary Code of Policies* section 30.060.2. provides that the Board shall establish the number of Executive Committee members at its first meeting each year – if it decides to appoint such a committee. Section 30.060.2. also provides that the president, president-elect, vice-president, and treasurer shall be appointed to serve on the committee, and for the Board to elect the balance of the committee and the committee chair.

In decision 267, June 2007, the Board adopted a “general secretary performance evaluation policy” as part of the Executive Committee's terms of reference.

*DECISION:* The Board, in accordance with RI Bylaws section 5.060.,

1. agrees to appoint an Executive Committee to be composed of seven members to serve for the period 1 July 2007 to 30 June 2008;

2. in accordance with *Rotary Code of Policies* section 30.060.2. appoints Wilfrid J. Wilkinson, Dong-Kurn Lee, Michael K. McGovern, and Ian H.S. Riseley as members of the Executive Committee, and elects Raffaele Pallotta d'Acquapendente, and Yoshimasa Watanabe as the other members, with Örsçelik Balkan to serve as chairman;
3. prescribes the following terms of reference under which the Executive Committee shall function:
  - a. Make decisions on behalf of the Board where the policy of the Board or of RI has been established or where an emergency exists, or as otherwise may be determined by the Board;
  - b. Make decisions when necessary relative to expenditures for which appropriations have been made by the Board and make emergency appropriations necessary to implement action taken by the Board;
  - c. Make appropriations, from funds not otherwise appropriated, of such additional amounts as may be recognizable as emergency requirements;
  - d. Explore matters requiring the attention of the Board and offer recommendations thereon to the Board and, when appropriate, refer a Board agenda item to the appropriate Board committee when the matter is outside the terms of reference of the Executive Committee;
  - e. Review reports of committees and, when necessary, take action upon matters contained therein subject to the provisions in item 3.a. of these terms of reference;
  - f. Evaluate the performance of the general secretary at least annually and report its findings to the Board as prescribed by the General Secretary Evaluation Policy and as further described herein;

**The following steps will be taken in the evaluation process**

- 1) Forty-five (45) days prior to the end of the term of the current RI Board of Directors, the general secretary will present to the RI president and chair of the Executive Committee a summary of the strategic goals

and objectives that were established for the year and an analysis of the progress that has been made on each of the goals and objectives detailed in the submittal.

- 2) Upon receipt of this submittal from the general secretary, the chair of the Executive Committee will provide a copy of the General Secretary Evaluation Policy and the strategic goals and objectives transmittal from the general secretary to all members of the Executive Committee. The chair of the Executive Committee will request that all performance evaluations be completed and returned to the chair no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the final meeting of the Executive Committee.
- 3) After the performance evaluations have been reviewed by the Executive Committee, a review of the performance evaluations will be conducted with the general secretary in a closed personnel session.
- 4) Any conclusions, directions, notes of progress and improvement, or any other related issue concerning the performance evaluation will be documented in a confidential memorandum, signed by the chair of the Executive Committee and the president of RI, and placed in the permanent general secretary personnel file retained in the Human Resources office.
- 5) At the conclusion of the performance evaluation process, the Executive Committee will review and evaluate the compensation of the general secretary and will recommend to the RI Board of Directors any adjustments that may be appropriate.
- 6) Any adjustment or modification to compensation or benefits for the general secretary must be approved by the RI Board of Directors.

**Subsequent year procedures**

- 7) Thirty (30) days prior to the commencement of the new term of the incoming Board of Directors, the general secretary will present to the president-elect and the

chair of the Executive Committee (proposed or appointed) the summary of the strategic goals and objectives established for the prior year, the summary of progress, and the strategic goals and objectives proposed for the ensuing year.

- 8) The president-elect and/or chair of the Executive Committee should provide a copy of the strategic goals and objectives for prior and ensuing years to members of the RI Board and The Rotary Foundation chair.
- g. Act as a personnel committee for the Board in all matters relating to the staff and their organization within the Secretariat of RI; and as such to
  - 1) counsel the general secretary in the appointment or dismissal by him of all general managers, provided that the general secretary shall also consult the chairman of the Foundation Trustees if such action applies to any general manager assigned to work full-time for The Rotary Foundation of RI;
  - 2) determine, on the recommendation of the general secretary, the salary range of all general managers;
  - 3) review annually compensation paid to “disqualified persons” of RI to determine whether such compensation is reasonable under the circumstances. Disqualified persons include any person, with respect to any transaction, who is in a position to exercise substantial influence over the affairs of the organization within five years prior to the date of the transaction. Disqualified persons include officers and certain senior staff;
  - 4) review and approve the level of proposed cost of living adjustments, compensation, and benefit improvements for the employees of the Secretariat.
4. notes that the president has appointed the following to serve during 2007-08 on the Joint Committee of RI Directors and Foundation Trustees: Wilfrid J. Wilkinson, Dong-Kurn Lee,

Michael K. McGovern, Ian H.S. Riseley, and Orşçelik Balkan.

#### **4. Appointments to 2007-08 RI Committees and Resource Groups, Including Terms of Reference and Liaison Directors**

*Statement:* RI Bylaws section 16.010. mandates that the Board shall “establish standing committees on communications, constitution and bylaws, conventions, districting, election review, finance, and Rotaract, as well as such other committees as it from time to time may determine is in the best interests of RI.” The numbers and terms of office for the standing committees are prescribed by RI Bylaws section 16.010. The number of members and terms of office for all other committees are determined by the Board. As provided in RI Bylaws section 16.020., the president announced the appointment of the members of the 2007-08 RI committees and resource groups, their terms of reference, and liaison directors.

**DECISION:** The Board

1. establishes on the recommendation of the president the 2007-08 RI committees and resource groups and their terms of reference, as shown in Appendix A;
2. offers to each committee and resource group the congratulations, encouragement, and support of the Board.

#### **5. Appointment of Rotary Foundation Trustees**

*Statement:* In accordance with RI Bylaws section 21.020., the president sought the Board’s approval of those Rotarians appointed by him as Foundation Trustees.

**DECISION:** The Board approves the appointment by the president of David D. Morgan, Louis Piconi, Jose Antonio Salazar-Cruz, and Carl-Wilhelm Stenhammar, each to serve for terms of four years from 1 July 2007 to 30 June 2011, as trustees of The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International.

#### **6. Tentative Future Agenda**

*Statement:* Board procedures require the submission at each meeting of a tentative agenda for the next Board meeting.

**DECISION:** The Board receives the tentative agenda for its November 2007 meeting.

## **7. Rotary Institutes Site and Date Approval**

*Statement:* As authorized by *Rotary Code of Policies* section 60.050.1., the president and president-elect approved the sites and dates of 2008-09 Rotary institutes.

**DECISION:** The Board ratifies the decision shown in Appendix B made by the president and president-elect on behalf of the Board regarding the tentative schedule of Rotary institutes in 2008-09.

## **8. Establishment of Districts within Zones for 2007-08**

*Statement:* Pursuant to RI Bylaws section 12.010.5., the Board considered the composition of RI zones for 2007-08.

**DECISION:** The Board agrees that the composition of the 34 zones for 2007-08 shall be as shown in Appendix C.

## **9. Selection of Zones to Nominate Directors for Election at the 2009 Convention**

*Statement:* The Board selected the zones that will nominate directors for election at the 2009 convention.

**DECISION:** The Board agrees that zones 3, 8, 10, 12, 16, 26, 31, and 34 shall select committees in 2007-08 to nominate RI directors for election at the 2009 convention.

## **10. Policies Relating to the RI Board**

*Statement:* The Board reviewed its standing policies and procedures concerning its functioning as a Board.

**DECISION:** The Board affirms the policies governing its work as shown in *Rotary Code of Policies* section 28.005., and agrees that these policies should continue to be reviewed at the Board's first meeting each Rotary year.

## **11. Committee Meetings in 2007-08**

*Statement:* The president presented a tentative schedule of committee meetings during 2007-08.

**DECISION:** The Board approves information presented at this meeting with respect to the tentative schedule of RI committee meetings in 2007-08.

## **12. Nominating Committee for RI President**

*Statement:* RI Bylaws section 11.050.2., as amended by the 2007 Council on Legislation, authorizes the Board to determine the time (not later than 15 August) and place for the meeting of the Nominating Committee for President. The committee shall consist of 34 members from the 34 zones constituted for the nomination of RI directors.

**DECISION:** The Board agrees that the Nominating Committee for President of RI in 2010-11 shall meet in Evanston, Illinois, USA, on Monday, 11 August 2008.

## **13. Travels of the RI President**

*Statement:* The president shared information with the Board regarding his proposed travels during 2007-08.

**DECISION:** The Board thanks President Wilkinson for sharing his tentative travel plans for the 2007-08 Rotary year.

## **14. Annual Review of Delegation of Authority to the President and the General Secretary**

*Statement:* At its July meeting each year, the Board reviews its delegation of authority to the president and the general secretary. In decision 226, June 2007, the Board adopted changes to the *Rotary Code of Policies* that placed all delegation of authority for the general secretary in one section of the *Code*, and all delegation of authority to the president in another section, thus simplifying the annual review process.

**DECISION:** The Board authorizes the president and the general secretary to act on its behalf on all matters listed in *Rotary Code of Policies* section 27.030. and sections 31.020. through 31.090.

## **15. Paid Attendance at the 2008 (Los Angeles) Convention**

*Statement:* Each year the Board designates those whose expenses in attending the next convention shall be paid by RI.

**DECISION:** The Board

1. agrees that RI and its Foundation shall pay the expenses of the following persons attending the 2008 convention of Rotary International:

- President and spouse
- President's aide and spouse
- President-elect and spouse
- President-elect's aide and spouse
- President-nominee and spouse
- President-nominee's aide and spouse
- Trustee chairman and spouse
- General secretary and spouse
- Directors and spouses
- Directors-elect and spouses
- Trustees and spouses
- Incoming trustees and spouses
- Past presidents (non-trustee) and spouses
- Sergeants-at-arms and spouses (includes chief SAA)
- 2009 convention chief sergeant-at-arms (to be funded by the 2009 convention budget)
- Deputy sergeants-at-arms (hotel, registration fee, and meals only)
- 2008 Convention Committee and spouses
- Secretariat staff as assigned by the general secretary
- President's (2007-08) immediate family, provided that the expenses of no more than 20 such members are paid by RI over a two-year period for the same officer serving first as president-elect and then as president at two consecutive conventions
- President-elect's (2008-09) immediate family, provided that the expenses of no more than 20 such members are paid by RI over a two-year period for the same officer serving first as president-elect and then as president at two consecutive conventions
- Any person assigned by the president or the Board to a place on the program of the convention, but who is not included in the above, may have his/her expenses paid by RI with the approval of the president;

2. notes that funds to cover the cost of these paid participants are included in the 2007-08 RI and Foundation budgets as shown in Appendix D, filed only with the official copy of these minutes;
3. requests the general secretary to include in the *Manual for Conventions* these above-named official participants, defining both their role at the

convention and the responsibility for the cost of their participation in the convention.

## **16. International Assembly Committee Report**

*Statement:* The 2008 International Assembly Committee shared with the Board the minutes of its May 2007 meeting in Evanston, Illinois, USA.

**DECISION:** The Board thanks the 2008 International Assembly Committee for its report.

## **17. District 5010 Proposal for Russian Clubs**

*Statement:* District 5010 petitioned the Board for consideration and approval of a proposed alternate leadership structure and funding mechanism to support the Russian Rotary clubs within the district. The district requested that the Board allow the establishment of a "Deputy District Governor," and that expenses for this officer— and for assistant governor(s) — to visit Rotary clubs in the district be eligible for reimbursement.

**DECISION:** The Board

1. thanks District 5010 for its proposal to provide additional support to its Russian clubs;
2. does not grant an exemption to its District Leadership Plan policies to allow District 5010 to establish the role of "Deputy District Governor," and suggests that the district leadership consider appointing an assistant governor as an alternative method of providing support to Russian clubs in the district;
3. agrees that travel expenses of assistant governors are an eligible expense category for reimbursement to governors whose districts have been allocated special training subsidies to support their clubs.

## **18. Rotary Foundation Programs Budget for 2007-08**

*Statement:* At their April 2007 meeting, the Foundation Trustees adopted a budget for Foundation programs in 2007-08. RI Bylaws section 22.050. requires the Board to approve all expenditures from the property of the Foundation, except for necessary administrative expenses and expenditures of the income or principal of gifts to the Foundation which are prescribed by the terms of the gift or bequest.

**DECISION:** The Board

1. approves the following budget for unrestricted program award expenditures to be made in 2007-08 from unrestricted Annual Programs Fund contributions:

2. agrees that the general secretary of The Rotary Foundation
  - a. may, for good cause and with the approval of the chairman of the Trustees, exceed any of the above budget items up to five percent provided that he submit an explanation therefore to the Trustees at their next meeting;
  - b. may exceed or under spend the 2007-08 District Designated Funds (DDF) budget amount for long-term disaster recovery to the extent that the actual 2007-08 DDF contributions differ from the budget amount of US\$200,000;
3. approves a budget of US\$3,000,000 for program award distributions from Donor Advised Funds, and agrees that the general secretary may exceed or under spend the 2007-08 Donor Advised budget based on properly approved donor-requested expenditures.

**19. Confirmation of the 2007-2008 RI Budget**

*Statement:* RI Bylaws section 17.050.1. provides that each year the Board shall adopt a budget for RI for the succeeding fiscal year. The Board has customarily reviewed this budget at its first meeting in the new year.

**DECISION:** The Board confirms the RI budget for 2007-08, as adopted by the Board in decision 312, June 2007, as follows:
